MCC : A BRIEF HISTORY

Mount Carmel College for women, owned and run by the congregation of the Carmelite Sisters of St. Teresa, founded in the year 1944 in Trichur (Under the title of Carmel College in the State of Cochin) under Madras University, was transferred to Bengaluru in 1948 to meet the increasing demand for women's education in India. Initially affiliated to Mysore University later it became an affiliated College of Bangalore University in 1964. MCC is a minority institution run primarily for Catholic Students but in the spirit of service, it opens its doors to those of all castes and creeds. It draws its inspiration from the person and teaching of Jesus Christ, Universal Master and Model of Education.

An Autonomous College since September 2005, affiliated to Bangalore University, Mount Carmel College is re-re-accredited in the third cycle with an 'A' Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2012. It is one of the few Colleges in India selected by UGC under the scheme, College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2006.

The College has been offering Under Graduate and Post Graduate Courses in Arts, Science, Commerce, Business Studies and Management. Results have always been very good with most of them securing Distinction and First Class. The student strength of the college in 1944 was 274, today it has a strength of over 5,600 students pursuing both Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programmes.

As a major step, the College established an Institute for Management Studies (MCIM) in 1992, with a view to provide women students an opportunity to pursue Management Education. The two year Post Graduate Programme in Management is recognized by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE).

Mount Carmel College offers various job oriented and skill based Under Graduate and Post Graduate programmes. It has well established research facilities, State of the Art laboratories

and facilitates research culture both among staff and students. In the year 2006 the Commerce Department and in the year 2015 Biotechnology, Botany, Electronics, Life Science, Home Science (Human Development, Food Science & Nutrition) and Economics Departments have been recognized as Research Centers by Bangalore University. Further IGNOU has recognized nine of the Departments as Research Centers from the Academic year 2010 – 11.

The College has been registered with the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR) and is recognized as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organization (SIRO) by the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India (Act 1988) in the year 2011.

Under the Under Graduate stream the college offers eleven Programmes in the Faculty of Arts, nineteen in the Faculty of Science and seven in the Faculty of Commerce, Business Studies and Management. Number of Post Graduate programmes have increased from three under the affiliated system to nineteen under the autonomous system. The College also offers four evening Post Graduate Diploma Programmes, two career oriented courses along with six skill based programmes in Healthcare and Cosmetology, Baking, Textile Designing and Construction, Sanitary Napkin Production, Chalk Making, Book Binding and Mushroom Cultivation and two Diploma Programmes under Mount Carmel Community College.

Annual Foundation Day Lecture

7th July is the foundation day of Mount Carmel College. College hosts an **Annual Foundation Day Lecture** on this day. The lecture series provides a platform for interaction of Carmelites with eminent persons in the field of public life, academics and management. The lecture will focus on issues relevant in the field of **Education, Science, Society** and **Polity** which would enrich the student community, academicians and society at large.

COURSES & COMBINATIONS OFFERED AT THE UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE LEVELS

The Undergraduate Degree Programmes are spread over six semesters, with two semesters per year. The Post Graduate Degree Programmes are spread over four semesters with two semesters per year. The semesters which shall ordinarily begin and end as:

- Odd Semester: June to October.
- Even Semester: November to April.
- Each Semester will be of a duration of nineteen weeks; fifteen weeks for teaching, one week for Continuous Internal Assessment tests and three weeks for End-Semester Examination (ESE).

Choice Based Credit System for Under Graduate and Post Graduate Programmes

Research and experience has proved that learner centric contextual curriculum and the desired learner outcomes can be achieved mainly through Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). With the objective of developing critical thinking as well as analytical ability, and empowering students with necessary skills ultimately making them suitable for an employment is the reason for MCC taking the lead in introducing CBCS for Post Graduate Programmes from the academic year 2014-15 and for Under Graduate Programmes from the academic year 2015-16.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS IN THE FACULTIES OF ARTS, SCIENCE, COMMERCE AND MANAGEMENT

PREAMBLE

The Choice Based Credit System ensures that the candidates graduating from a college or a University are at par with the global practices in terms of academic standards and evaluation strategies. In the emerging trend of Internationalization of Indian Higher Education, it is imperative that the Universities in India should follow this system, while retaining the structure of the present undergraduate program. The mobility of their products, both within and across the geographical jurisdiction becomes possible. Mount Carmel College, Autonomous deems it fit to introduce Choice Based Credit System at the undergraduate level in the faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce and Management, effective from the academic year 2015-16.

FEATURES OF CREDIT BASED SEMESTER SCHEME

Each course shall carry certain number of credits. Credits normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as the number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning outcomes, maximum marks, etc.

General features of the Credit Based Semester Scheme are:

1. The relative importance of subjects of study is quantified in terms of credits.
2. The subjects of study include general, core, mandatory, and interdisciplinary/skill development courses.
3. Students shall take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

4. The declaration of results is based on the Aggregate percentage of marks obtained as well as on Aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned.

SUBJECTS OF STUDY: Subjects of study shall comprise of the following:

PART I – GENERAL COURSES: LANGUAGES

Two languages are mandatory, of which one shall be General English as compulsory subject, and the other shall be either an Indian language or a foreign language. Any one second language could be selected from Kannada, Sanskrit, Hindi, Additional English, French and German.

- There will be 4 lecture hours per week for General English and Languages.
- In addition to General English, a candidate shall opt for any one of the second languages studied at the Pre-University or equivalent level.
- Speech/hearing/visually impaired/mentally challenged and study disabled students are exempted from studying one of the languages prescribed above.
- Value Education/Religion Courses is mandatory for all the Six Semesters.

PART II – CORE COURSES: OPTIONAL SUBJECTS

A candidate shall ordinarily opt for any three Humanities subjects for a B.A. Degree Programme and any three Science subjects for a B.Sc. Degree Programme, Subjects studied during the course of B.Com Degree Programme are specific to Accounting and Commerce and subjects studied during the course of BBA Programme are papers specific to functional areas of Business Management with specialization in Finance, HRM, Marketing and International Business.

PART III

(A) Value Education/Religion (Common for all Programmes)

Value Education/Religion Courses are compulsory in all the Six Semesters. There will be one lecture hour a week allotted for these courses, and will be assigned 1 credit. The credits earned for Value Education/Religion Courses **will not be included** for the calculation of **SGPA** and **CGPA**. However, the student **will not be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examination** if she fails to secure the credits for Value Education/Religion courses.

(B) Mandatory Courses (MC – Common for all Programmes)

Mandatory Courses are compulsory in all the Six Semesters. There will be **two lecture hours a week** allotted to these courses in **Semesters I, II, V and VI, and one lecture hour a week in Semesters III and IV respectively**. The **courses** offered are:

*Students in Courses which offer Entrepreneurship as part of the curriculum need not take up the mandatory course in Entrepreneurship offered along with Financial and Legal Literacy.

(C) Interdisciplinary Courses (IC)

Any one Interdisciplinary / Skill Development Course in the Third Semester and any one Interdisciplinary / Skill Development Course in Fourth Semester will be taken up, as prescribed by the concerned faculty and approved by the Academic Council.

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES – CLASSES AND GRADES

End Semester Examination results after each semester shall be declared in terms of classes on the basis of percentage of aggregate marks scored as well as represented in terms of Grade Points.

Grade Point Weight is calculated as the product of Grade Points earned and the credits assigned for a paper.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed by dividing the Sum of the Grade Point Weights of all the subjects of study by the maximum credits for the semester.

The results of successful candidates at the end of Six Semesters shall be classified on the basis of aggregate percentage of marks obtained in all the Six Semesters, and the Aggregate or Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for award of Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. An eight point Letter/ Alpha Sign Grade shall be adopted.

Choice Based Credit System for Post Graduation Studies

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS), which is in vogue in most of the Universities, is a vital tool of bringing the transformation in the traditional higher education system of India. CBCS operates on modular pattern based on module/units called “credits” wherein ‘credit’ defines the quantum of contents/syllabus prescribed for a course/paper and determines the minimum number of teaching-learning hours required.

The ultimate goal is to bring reforms in higher education so that students develop thinking as well as analytical ability, he/she gets equipped with necessary skills ultimately making him/her suitable for an employment and to integrate values of our culture with education.

Introduction of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Cumulative Grade Point Average Method of Evaluation (CGPA)

Definitions and Classification of Courses under the CBCS

Programme means a particular field of study comprising of several courses chosen for the award of the degree in that field.

Duration of programme means the time period required for the conduct of the programme. The duration of Post Graduate Degree Programme shall be four semesters distributed over a period of two years.

Course means a subject of study in a programme.

Semester means a term consisting of a minimum of five months including the days of examination.

Credit of a course is a measure of the weekly unit of work assigned for the course.

Credit defines the quantum of content/syllabus prescribed for the course. It may be a unit prescribed for a course and is determined by the number of hours of instruction required per week. Thus, in each course credits will be assigned on the basis of the no. of hours required per week for lectures/tutorials/lab work/field work to complete the course in a single semester.

1 credit = 1 hour of direct teaching / week

1 credit = 2 hours of lab work /week

1 credit = 2 hours of field work /project /week

Thus, 1 credit course requires 1 hour per week during a 15 week semester and accordingly a 3 credit or 4 credit courses requires 3 or 4 hours per week during a 15 week semester.

A course which has 3-4 hours per week per semester with weightage of 3 to 4 credits is considered as a full course.

A paper with 2 credits is like a half paper.

A course of 3 credits may be so designed that there will be 2 credits for theory and 1 credit for lab work/ field work/ project work.

A course of 4 credits may be so designed that there will be 3 credits for theory and 1 credit for lab work/ field work/ project work.

Typically a course will comprise of 4(four) units.

Core Course (CC) refers to that course which embodies skills and knowledge considered essential and thus made mandatory for all students pursuing a particular programme, it involves a course of study that is deemed central.

Allied Course (AC) is the one which is closely related to core course, which facilitates the understanding of the core course and hence made mandatory for a particular programme of study.

Soft Course (SC) is a course which enhances the personal attributes of an individual's interactions, job performance and career prospects and entrepreneurial qualities.

Multidisciplinary Course (MC) is a cross disciplinary and combines several fields of study or academic interests beyond the core courses and allied courses for a given programme.

Elective is a group of courses that a student can select from among given alternative groups.

Tutorial component is included in one core course or elective course every semester. It consists of journal paper discussions / problem solving / participatory discussions / self study / presentations and it increases the student's potential to assimilate the content delivered during a lecture session.

COURSE REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION

I. UNDER GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

BACHELOR OF ARTS

A candidate who has passed the two year PUC Examination of the Karnataka Pre-University Board with any combination of optional subjects or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to B.A. Degree course.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE

- a. A Candidate who has passed the two year PUC Examination of the Karnataka Pre - University Education Board consisting of at least two Science subjects as optionals (As enumerated in Regulations under the Faculty of Science) or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to B.Sc degree course.
- b. A candidate for the B.Sc degree should opt for at least two of the optional subjects taken at the Pre-University Level.
- c. A candidate opting for Statistics at B.Sc level should have studied Statistics or Mathematics at the Pre-University Course.
- d. A candidate opting for Physics at B.Sc level should have studied Mathematics in addition to Physics in the Pre-University Course.
- e. A candidate opting for Botany and Zoology should have studied Biology at the Pre-University Course.
- f. A Candidate opting for Home Science should have studied at least two science subjects at the Pre-University Course.
- g. Only those students who have taken Mathematics in Pre-University or equivalent examination are eligible for admission to B.Sc with Computer Science/Electronics as one of the Optional subjects.

BACHELOR OF COMMERCE

- a. Students who have completed two year Pre-University Examinations of Karnataka State or equivalent Examination thereto shall be eligible for admission to B.Com Degree Course (Preference will be given to students who have studied Commerce and Accountancy in Pre-University Course).
- b. Candidates who have passed Diploma in Business Administration Examination conducted by the Directorate of Technical Education in

Karnataka may be held eligible for admission directly to I year B.Com degree course. (ACA/R4/EQUL/9/83-84, Dated 08.02.84)

- c. Candidates who have passed Diploma in Secretarial/Commercial Practice conducted by the Board of Technical Examination, Karnataka may also be held eligible for admission directly to II year B.Com Degree Course. (ACA/R4/MISC/92-93, Date 31.07.82)

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Candidates who have passed Pre-University Examination (10+2 Examination) conducted by the Karnataka Pre-University Board or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto are eligible for admission to BBA Course.

Note: Original certificates will have to be produced during the time of admission or on the re-opening day, failing which admission will remain cancelled.

Fees for every course will be notified at the beginning of the academic year. Once admitted, fees will not be refunded. Students discontinuing a course will be required to pay the entire course fee to be eligible for issue of Transfer Certificate.

Students applying for scholarship and free studentship will pay the tuition fees until the scholarships are announced. Concessions will be withdrawn if unsatisfactory progress or behavior is observed

CREDIT / CERTIFICATE / HONOURS / ADD ON COURSES (for III Year UG Students only)

A total of 15 Theory Hours constitutes 1 credit

A total of 20 Theory + Practical Hours constitutes 1 credit

A total of 30 Practicals Hours constitutes 1 credit

Every Student has to enroll and complete atleast six credits through Certificate/ Honours Programmes over three years in addition to the courses in Value Education, Indian Constitution, Human Rights, Environmental Studies and Basics in Computers. For eg. Sports, Music, Dance, NCC, NSS, Outreach Programmes, working with NGOs etc, (for details please refer Student Handbook).

II. POST GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

THE OBJECTIVES

1. To be a role model of educational institutions in the country.
2. To fulfill the Vision and Mission of the College.
3. To develop Humanistic, Scientific, Technological and Managerial manpower of highest quality.

8. To provide a capacity to learn continually and interact with multi-disciplinary groups.
9. To develop the student with a capacity for :
 - i. Free and objective enquiry,
 - ii. Courage and integrity,
 - iii. Awareness and sensitivity to the needs and aspirations of society.
10. To promote healthy practices, community services, extension activities and industrial linkages for socio – economic growth and promote national integration.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

M.A. and **M.Sc.:** Admission to these Post Graduate Courses will be open to a candidate who has obtained at least 50% aggregate in qualifying examination and holds an Under Graduate Degree from recognized university in appropriate discipline.

M.Com General and M.Com Industry Integrated Courses

A candidate who has passed the B.Com / BBM / BBA Degree Examination of this University or of any other University recognized as equivalent there to and has secured not less than 50% of the marks in the aggregate in Commerce / Management subjects in all the examinations of the B.Com / BBM / BBA Course shall be eligible for admission to the

M.Com Course. In the case of SC/ST students and blind students, the minimum percentage of marks required is 45%.

M.Com International Business and PGDBA Courses

A candidate who has passed the three year Degree Course in any discipline (Commerce, Management, Arts, Science, Engineering etc.) from a recognized University and has secured not less than 50% of the marks in the aggregate of all the examinations of the Course shall be eligible for admission to the Course. In the case of SC/ST students and blind students, the minimum percentage of marks required is 45% in aggregate.

MCA

A three year Degree in any discipline from a recognized University with a minimum of 50% in the aggregate (including languages) of all the semesters. However in the case of SC and ST applicants it is 45% in the aggregate.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission of the MCA/ M.Sc/ M.A/ M.Com/ PGDBA programmes shall be made on the basis of Marks obtained in the Qualifying examination and performance in the personal Interview.

CATEGORY – WISE SELECTION CRITERIA

Admissions are purely based on merit. Due consideration is given to the reservation policy of the Government as applicable to the Minority Institutions.

DURATION OF POST GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

All Post Graduate Courses will be of Four Semesters (Two academic years) duration, whereas MCA has Six Semesters (three years) and PGDBA has Two Semesters (one year).

TEMPORARY DISCONTINUATION

A student may be permitted to discontinue temporarily from the programme for a semester or longer for reasons of ill health or other valid reasons. Normally a student will be permitted to discontinue from the programme only for a maximum cumulative duration of two semesters,

provided she can complete the programme within the prescribed duration of two years. She will be charged continuation fee as decided by the institution / college from time to time.

ATTENDANCE

Record of attendance will be maintained. Attendance shall be taken at the beginning of each hour.

It is compulsory for students to maintain a minimum of 80% attendance in all subjects and in all semesters to be eligible to appear for the End Semester Examination.

No student may be absent from class without permission. Leave letters must be addressed to the Principal and countersigned by the Parent / Guardian / Warden. The leave letters must be signed by all subject teachers and handed over to the class mentor. However, attendance cannot be claimed for such absence.

Leave application for reasons of illness beyond three to four days must be accompanied by a medical certificate and medical bills.

For feedback on attendance and progress, parents have to meet the respective class mentor during parent-mentor meeting as scheduled in the calendar.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES AND DOCUMENTS

1. No Certificate shall be granted, unless a student has maintained the attendance prescribed by the College and abides by the rules and regulations of the college.
2. Certificates will be issued only when all dues to the college are paid.
3. Student applying for a Transfer, Conduct and Course Certificate shall be issued the same on payment of the required fee.
4. Extract from University or College Results Register or College Admission Register will be issued on payment of the required fee.
5. All financial transactions to the college should be done through UCO Bank located in the college premises/Vijaya Bank on Cunningham Road.

6. Every application for a certificate should be made atleast three days before the certificate is required and should contain all particulars regarding the student's name, identity card number, year of the examination passed and subjects taken under part I, II and III.
7. A postal cover must be forwarded with every application for information, along with the necessary postal charges without which no application or correspondence will be entertained.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students will treat the building, furniture and equipment with great care. Any loss or destruction of these will be chargeable, individually or collectively.

Students will keep the campus clean. Students found littering the campus will be fined.

Students will be in their places in the class room at the first bell, maintain silence till the lecturer arrives.

Discipline should be maintained in class. Insubordinate and rude behavior of any kind to the staff of the college will be strictly dealt with. Repeated violation of rules can lead to rustication.

Strikes and similar demonstrations are not allowed but a respectful representation of grievances will be looked into.

GENERAL

Students will carry their Identity Card with them at all times. This will be shown to authorized persons when demanded.

Students are advised to **refer to the college notice boards** every day for information.

The students should make good use of library facilities in a responsible manner.

Refinement should be observed, especially in the canteen and care taken to keep it litter free.

All stray and unclaimed property shall be brought to the Principal's office.

No books, pamphlets, papers, banners or posters will be circulated or exhibited by the students, nor tickets for any programme sold within the premises without the express permission of the Principal.

There shall be no money raised for any purpose whatsoever, or gifts made to staff members or others without the permission of the Principal.

Students will not see their visitors in college. They will have the letters, money orders and other communications addressed to their home or hostels.

Excursions if any, of long or short duration will be organized by the college authorities only. There will be no picnics organized by the students without the express permission of the principal.

The college will not be responsible for any casualty or untoward incident within the campus.

All extra curricular activities will be held only after class hours and on Saturdays.

STUDENT COMMITMENTS

Each student accepts the responsibility to uphold the standards of the college, whether on or off the campus.

1. The day begins with a common morning prayer in which all participate.
2. The College expects students to attend classes regularly. Attendance is taken at every lecture, practical or tutorial hour as prescribed by the college time table.
3. Examinations are held at the end of every semester. Students are expected to write the tests and do the assignments given in each subject during the month. Attendance requirements must be fulfilled by every student in each paper.
4. Students should wear formals everyday. Students are expected to wear simple and modest clothes, avoiding sleeveless tops, tights, mini skirts, shorts and flimsy clothes.

5. The use of mobiles on campus is banned.
6. Students must always maintain the decorum and discipline befitting the institution.
7. All grievances will be addressed by the student's grievance cell.
8. Students posting information about the peers, staff and institution in cyber / electronic media / social networking sites etc. will be dealt with severely.
9. Carrying of any plastic items and carry bags into the college premises is prohibited, to ensure a plastic free zone.

To provide them with an opportunity for involvement in the development of the country.

To equip them with a sound theoretical formation that will provide the answers to the problems facing them.

To transform the Church in order to make it more credible to the times in the true spirit of the Gospel.

To join hands with similar student organizations both at national and international levels in their common efforts towards the development and liberation of man.

The CSA prayer group meets once a week for Praise and Worship.

The Coordinators of CSA organize Catholic doctrine classes for all the degree Catholic students.

The Annual inter-collegiate CSA fest (STAUROS) is organized every year.

CSA conducts various competitions during Christmas to share the Joy of Christmas.

Co-Curricular Activities

College Associations

There are over twenty associations i.e: Alumni, Catholic Students, Commerce, Dramatics, Fine Arts, Humanities, Management, Indian Dance, Indian Music, International Students', Kannada Sangha, Languages, National Cadet Corps, National Social Service, Public Speaking, Quiz, Science, Sports and Games, Western Dance, Western Music and Women's Cell.

There are two clubs - Phoenix Nature Club and Rotaract Club.

There are three cells - E-Cell, Human Rights and Legal Literacy Cell and Women's Cell.

The Vice President and office bearers of the various associations will conjointly so plan their meetings at the beginning of each term, that there will be one association meeting every week.

The associations award prizes at the end of the year to their best speakers, elocutionists and others, in the events held.

Speakers of repute are invited to deliver lectures during the year. Students are advised to play an active part in all the meetings, and lectures are designed to prepare them for public life and develop initiative.

Office Bearers: The Vice Presidents will be members of the Staff. The Secretaries shall be appointed yearly from among the students.

The Principal is ex-officio President of all the associations and clubs.

Physical Education

Games and Sports: All the students of the College are expected to take part in games and sports especially in the inter-collegiate events of Bangalore University.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme is a community service programme sponsored by Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India and the State Government.

The aim of NSS is "the improvement of personality through service to community". It arouses the social consciousness of students and facilitates them to work creatively and constructively.

A student enrolled in NSS is expected to put in a minimum of 120 hours of social work and also attend a special camp during the course of the academic year.

After the completion of 240 hours a student will be awarded a diploma certificate in social service by the Bangalore University.

Students can enroll themselves as volunteers with the college NSS Unit.

National Cadet Corps (NCC) (Senior Wing)

NCC Unit at MCC was the first women NCC Unit to start in Karnataka (1954). The National Cadet Corps provides an opportunity for developing qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship; and the ideal of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens. A unit of the NCC girl's wing is functioning in the college. A Commissioned Lady Officer commands it.

Students of First year Degree class are eligible for enrollment if they satisfy physical fitness standards prescribed by the NCC. Enrollment will be made at the beginning of the academic year and the same shall be done in the prescribed format. All cadets will be provided with a set of uniforms free of cost by the unit. The same shall be returned at the end of the year.

Every cadet enrolled has to attend the parades conducted regularly. A minimum of 85% attendance at the parades is required. This will entitle them to appear for the B & C Certificate examinations. They are also required to attend the annual camp.

The Government offers certain incentives by way of certain seats in professional courses being reserved for those who excel in NCC. Those who pass C certificate examination can get into the Short Service Commission in the Army. NCC also provides opportunity in a lot of adventure activities like Para gliding, Para sailing, trekking and mountaineering etc.

Attendance shall be compulsory at the NCC Parade, Classes and Camps. Cadets shall not absent themselves without the permission of the Principal. Attendance at Camps will be counted towards total attendance. A cadet will be required to obtain 80% of the total attendance i.e. normal working days plus camp period.

Cadets should return the NCC clothing and equipment issued to them as per the directions of the NCC authorities concerned, or make good the losses, failure to comply will result in the student not being permitted to take up the examination.

The College Magazine

The Magazine is published annually. The students shall make it their individual concern that the magazine keeps its tone and interest by the

contribution of their best literary efforts to it by the end of each academic year.

Students are expected to carefully read the Magazine and circulate it among their friends.

Centre for Extended Education

Centre for Extended Education manages and coordinates a wide range of short term, vocational, skill oriented credit course, which will help empower students to succeed in the dynamic globalised environment. Over 85 courses offered in the current year provides an interdisciplinary approach to learning and keeps a record of the additional credits a student acquires.

Committees / Associations

1. **IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)** makes the vision of Mount Carmel College come alive through various programmes, assessments, seminars and conferences for staff.
2. **Autonomy Task Force Committee** is entrusted with the task of implementations of rules and regulations / special tasks, which govern the autonomous functioning of the college.
3. **Admission Committee** takes care of every aspect of the admission process, starting from announcement of dates for application, scrutiny and data entry, criteria for selection, conducting interviews as also addressing grievances.
4. **Academic Deans Committee** is in charge of overseeing allotment of work to the staff. It assists with overall discipline and attends to student and staff concerns as and when they arise.
5. **Attendance Committee** checks regularly matters relating to student attendance. Regular display of attendance shortage lists help students to meet the college requirements.
6. **Cultural Events Committee** comprises of members closely involved with the art, music and dance associations. Apart from monitoring standards and supervising events, it also aims at motivating and providing opportunities for participation in these activities to a large number of students.
7. **Discipline Committee** enforces discipline on the campus during class hours, fests and functions. It restricts the indiscriminate use of mobile phones and maintains standards of modesty in dress on campus.
8. **Examination Committee** is entirely in charge of managing the logistics of all college examinations. A skilful management of time, space and

human resources covers all procedures, right from the announcement of examination dates to the timely issue of results and marks statements.

9. **Human Rights and Legal Aid Cell** undertakes various awareness projects, programmes and working with NGOs.
10. **Library Committee** will work to create a student-friendly atmosphere in the library while inculcating in them a sense of responsibility in using its facilities.
11. **Magazine Committee** brings out an annual magazine, which is a chronicle of important events and developments in colleges. This magazine is also a forum for students and staff to express their ideas and creativity. The production of the magazines involves students at every level.
12. **Maintenance Committee** will keep a check on all the utility services and facilities.
13. **Public Relations Committee** represents Mount Carmel College to outside individuals and agencies such as guests, visitors, other colleges, institutions and the Press.
14. **Research Committee** is in charge of and runs the research centre, which is a central facility providing space and other conveniences to staff and students to engage in research work.
15. **Student Welfare Committee** acts as a vital link between the Principal / Management Students Union and the students. It oversees implementation of institutional policies in matters regarding discipline and smooth conduct of events, both academic and cultural.
16. **Sports Committee** takes care of the conduct of all sports events including the Annual Sports Day and other inter-collegiate tournaments. It also oversees the selection of students for various State-level, National and International competitions.
17. **Staff Welfare Committee** comprising of members from the teaching, non teaching and support staff, looks into the welfare proposals for all sections of the staff, including the setting up of a welfare fund to help needy staff.
18. **Research Journal Committee** is in charge of publishing the staff journal 'Carmelight' which includes articles, research papers, reports, extracts and any other related publications with the aim of building an active academic community on campus.
19. **Value Education Committee** plans and coordinates weekly value education classes, arranges special lectures and sessions on various issues eg., Modules on women's issues, interpersonal relationships,

community service, career guidance etc. and culminate with visits to places that enhance and reinforce the students awareness of these issues.

20. **Women's Cell** sensitizes the students about women's issues, organises programmes on engendering Law in collaboration with NGOs and other groups / individuals.
21. **Calendar Committee** is incharge of compiling and making changes in the calendar of events.
22. **Grievance Committee** comprising of Deans, Students Welfare Team, parents and student representatives is responsible for resolving grievances arising from time to time.
23. **Staff Grievance and Welfare Committee** is incharge of addressing the problems of staff members.
24. **Committee Against Sexual Harassment (CASH)** works to prevent discrimination and sexual harassment against women, by promoting gender amity among students and employees. Deals with cases of discrimination and sexual harassment against women, in a time bound manner, aiming at ensuring support services to the victimized and termination of the harassment, further recommend appropriate punitive action against the guilty party to the Principal.
25. **Anti-Ragging Cell** will be the Supervisory and Advisory Committee on matters of Planning Action for Building and Preserving a Culture of Ragging Free Environment in the College Campus. The Anti Ragging Committee will engage in the works of checking places like Hostels, Canteens, Classrooms and other places of student congregation for any incidences of Ragging, and shall educate the students at large in the College about Menace of Ragging and related Punishment Provisions.
26. **Cyber Crime Bullying Committee** works to create awareness among the students through workshops and seminars on Cyber Crime and to take appropriate actions against Cyber victimization.
27. **Student's Academic Council** consists of students who excel in academics and extra curricular activities besides possessing the qualities of hard work and commitment to offer constructive feedback to improve the curriculum. The Council will also bring to the notice of Heads of Department, Deans and the Principal, any irregularity in the completion of the syllabus or deviation from the prescribed course content both in theory and practicals.
28. **Placement Cell** plays a pivotal role in creating the linkage between industry and college. The Placement Cell imparts training and prepares

students for corporate life. Its primary role is providing campus placements in the best companies for our students.

29. **Entrepreneurial Cell** works for fostering the spirit of entrepreneurship and intrapreneurship among students by creating an environment with diverse opportunities for new growth and development as entrepreneurs and competent professionals. E-Cell works in collaboration with National Entrepreneurial Network (NEN – a Wadhvani Foundation), AWAKE and Junior Achievement.

30. **Former Student Association (Alumni)** (www.mountcarmelites.com) The College FSA is the link between former students and the college, between the past, the present and the future.

The college F.S.A aims at including in its membership list, every student who has once been in the college however long or short the time may have been, but it has a special place in its heart for students who have completed the full course in the college and graduated from it. Every member is expected to bring in new members.

The F.S.A meets at least twice a year. The Secretaries convene the meeting. The office bearers are elected at the last meeting of the preceding year.
